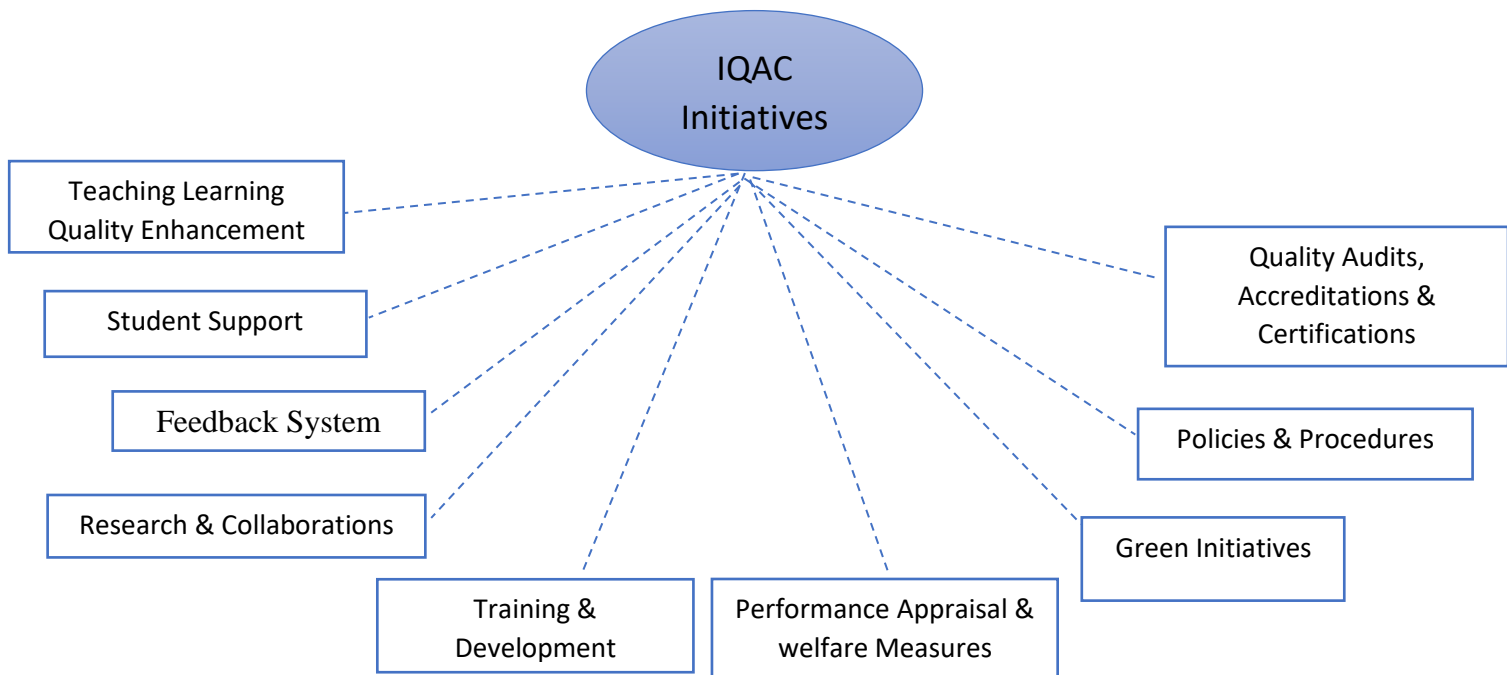
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## INITIATIVES OF INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

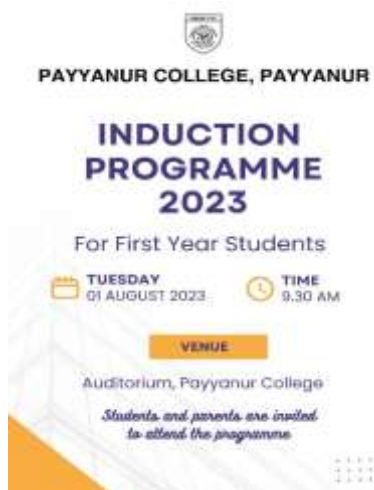
**Teachers Diary:** In line with the institution's commitment to accountability and transparency, the IQAC has taken an initiative to maintain teacher's diary by all faculties. This diary serves as a record of their professional activities both on and off-campus, including leaves availed, valuation duties, invigilation duties, and any innovative teaching methods adopted. By recording their activities, faculty members contribute to a culture of accountability and continuous improvement, facilitating the evaluation and refinement of teaching practices.



**Mentoring System:** Mentoring system has been established in the college to provide holistic support to students and enabling them to navigate their academic journey with confidence and resilience. Through personalized mentorship sessions, students receive emotional support, guidance, and encouragement, empowering them to overcome challenges and pursue their career aspirations effectively. This mentoring framework helps in enhancing student outcomes and making a supportive learning environment conducive to academic excellence and personal growth.



**Orientation Programme & Bridge Course:** Each academic year at College commences with a comprehensive orientation program designed to acquaint first-year students with the college's facilities, rules and regulations followed by the institution and available resources. Led by the Principal, this program offers invaluable insights into academic expectations, time schedules, available scholarships, and other essential information. Additionally, under the monitoring of IQAC, individual departments conduct bridge courses aimed at bridging the gap between school-level education and college-level curriculum. This course provides students with a deeper understanding of the new curriculum and structure and ensuring a smooth transition into college life.



**Certificate Courses:** As a part of holistic education, the college offers a diverse range of certificate courses aimed at enhancing students' skill sets and knowledge base. These courses, conducted by various departments, cover a wide array of topics, including household cultivation, photography techniques, gender sensitivity and interdisciplinary topics. During the year 2022-23, IQAC directly conducted a certificate course at college level for the second-year students. Around 600 students participated in the programme. By participating in these courses, students not only acquire valuable skills but also absorb important values and perspectives essential for personal and professional development. Upon successful completion of these courses, students receive certificates recognizing their achievements and contributions.



**Result Analysis:** After the publication of every semester result, the IQAC organizes department meetings to analyse student performance comprehensively. These meetings serve as platforms for evaluating academic outcomes, identifying areas of strength and improvement, and devising appropriate intervention strategies. Through collaborative discussions and result analysis, faculty members and IQAC jointly developed strategies aimed at enhancing student learning outcomes and overall academic excellence.

## FEEDBACK SYSTEM

IQAC has successfully implemented 360 Degree feedback system with in our institution to evaluate the performance of teaching and non-teaching staff. It involves collecting feedback from all stakeholders including students, alumni, employers and PTA. This system helps to identify the area for development and enable professional development.

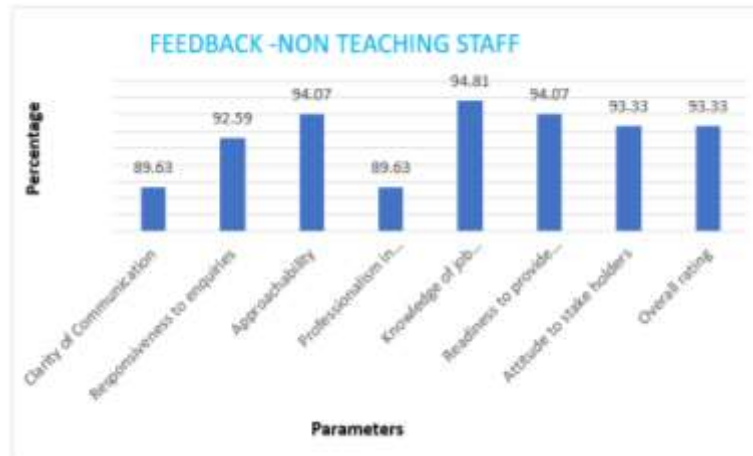
### Teaching Staff:

Feedback on individual teacher performance is collected from students through a well-structured questionnaire that covers all dimensions of the teacher's role. Feedback from parents is received in PTA meetings. Informal feedback is collected from alumni also. The Principal analyses the feedback and consolidated feedback report is given to individual teachers. Action to be taken report on low scoring areas is collected from the teachers which help them to address their shortcomings and improve their performance.



### Non-Teaching Staff:

Feedback is collected by IQAC from stakeholders viz. principal, teachers and students for evaluating their performance in terms of professionalism, approachability etc. The feedback is analysed by IQAC and report is served to individual staff and action to be taken report is collected.



## RESEARCH & COLLABORATIONS

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has spearheaded numerous initiatives aimed at nurturing a culture of research and collaboration within the institution. Through the collaborations with external institutions and the implementation of innovative practices, IQAC has significantly enriched the academic landscape of the college.

**Research Methodology/IPR Seminars and Workshops:** IQAC, in collaboration with various departments, organized a series of research methodology and IPR seminars and workshops tailored to the specific needs of each discipline. These initiatives aimed to enhance research skills and promote interdisciplinary collaboration among faculty and students. Moreover, departments were instructed to prioritize research and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) in their respective fields. For instance, the Economics department entered into collaborations with leading postgraduate colleges in Kannur district to initiate the "Ecohort" Research Methodology Workshop Series. Similarly, the Mathematics department conducted a one-day workshop on LATEX, emphasizing practical research skills.

**Establishment of New Research Centers:** Responding to the demands of scholars, IQAC facilitated the establishment of two additional research centers within Payyanur College. This expansion, particularly in the English and Chemistry departments, signifies a commitment to enhancing research infrastructure and facilitating academic pursuits.

**Collaborations, MOUs and Linkage:** IQAC Payyanur College has made collaborative partnerships with Six various institutions in Kerala for academic and auditing initiatives. This



collaborative approach not only enhances accountability and transparency but also promotes sustainable practices within the college campus.

**Research Forum and WhatsApp Group:** In collaboration with the Research and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Committee, IQAC established a forum for research scholars registered with Payyanur College. This initiative facilitated the creation of a WhatsApp group where scholars and faculty members from diverse departments share research activities and publications. Subsequently, a dedicated research room was approved by the principal to cater to the needs of research scholars.

## TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT

The institution is focused to enhance its staff continuously by implementing strategically designed professional development programmes. To enhance the competency of the staff, both teaching and non-teaching, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell has organised well-structured professional development programmes on campus and has motivated and deputed them to attend various similar programmes offered by other institutions.

The programmes organised by the college for teachers, piloted by the IQAC, were mainly on online teaching techniques, research and IPR, NEP, orientation programme for new teachers, NAAC accreditation awareness programme, E-resource management etc. For the non-teaching staff, general administrative ability and career enhancement, computer-assisted office management etc. were the focal areas.

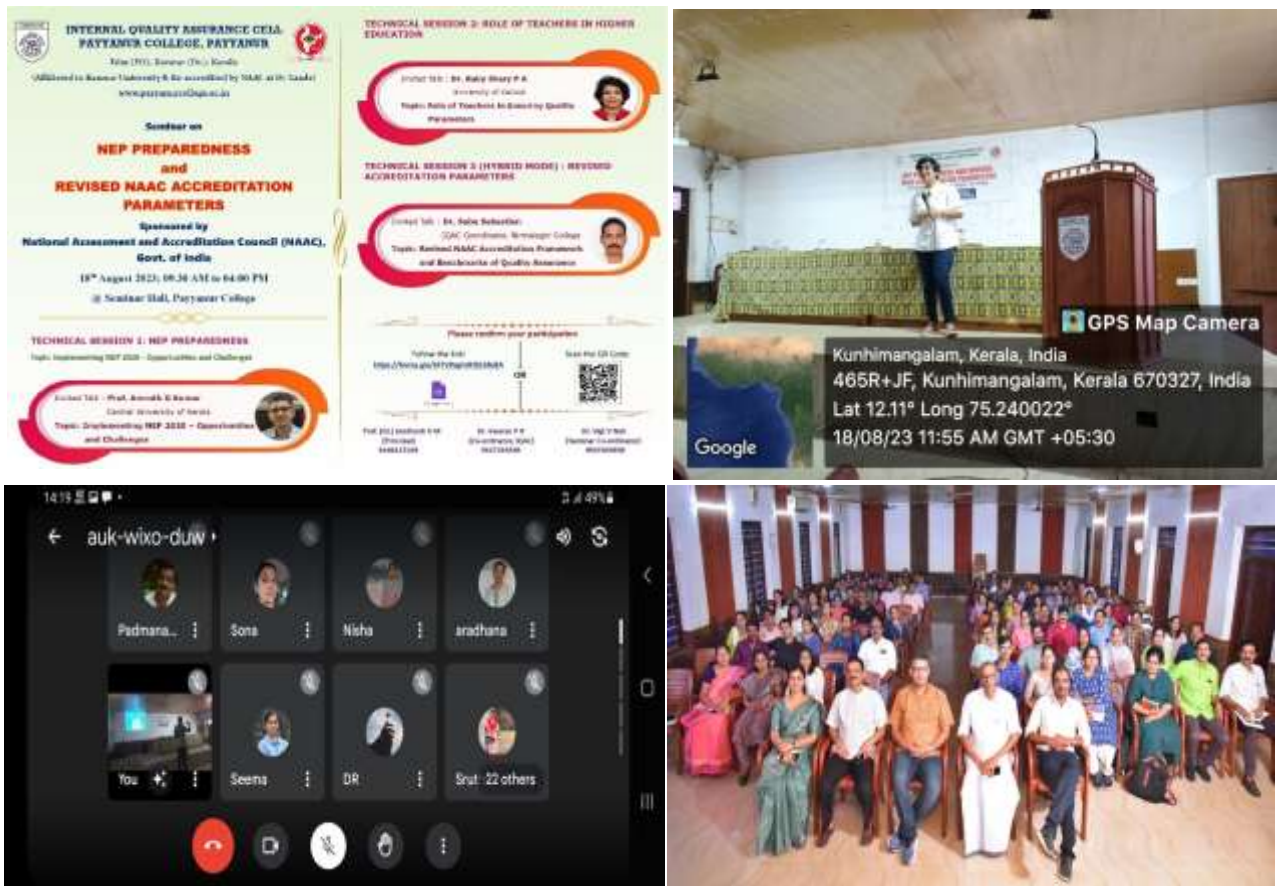

**NAAC SPONSORED SEMINAR ON NEP PREPAREDNESS AND REVISED NAAC ACCREDITATION PARAMETERS**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Payyanur College, Payyanur, organized NAAC sponsored seminar titled "NEP Preparedness and Revised NAAC Accreditation Parameters." This program aimed to address the vital aspects of the National Education Policy (NEP) and the updated accreditation parameters set forth by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Government of India. The first technical session of the seminar handled by Prof. Amruth G Kumar who emphasized that NEP 2020 offers a holistic vision for higher education. The second session delivered by Dr. Baby Shary P A. The session enlightened that the teachers in higher education often serve as mentors to their students. The last session of the seminar highlighted the significance of NAAC accreditation and the role it plays in enhancing the quality of higher education institutions. The session with Dr. Sabu Sebastian promises to

be an insightful journey into the revised NAAC accreditation framework and the benchmarks of quality assurance. The hybrid mode seminar witnessed an overwhelmed physical participation with 85 external and internal delegates and 21 online participants. The seminar came to an end with National Anthem.

### FACULTY DEVELOPMENT TRAINING PROGRAMME

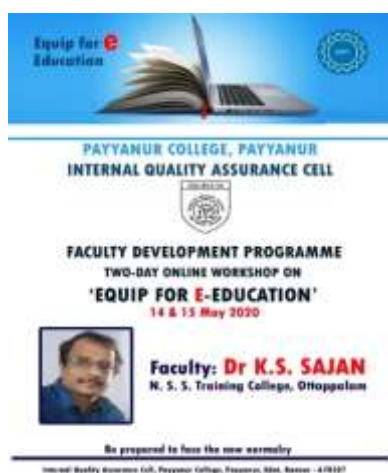

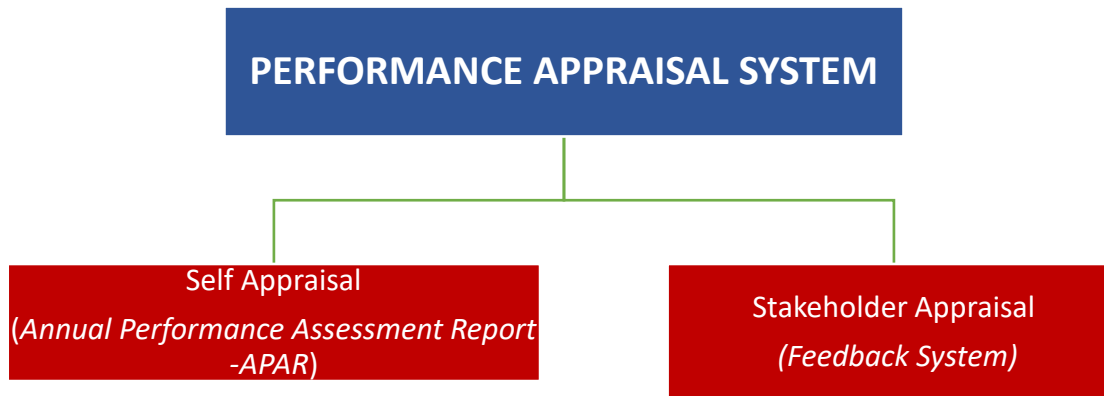


### FDP ON CAREER ADVANCEMENT FOR NON-TEACHING STAFF

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### INTRODUCTION

Payyanur College, Payyanur is a grant-in-aid, postgraduate, Arts and Science College run by Payyanur Educational Society and recognized by the UGC. The college came into existence in 1965 with affiliation to Kerala University and currently the college is affiliated to Kannur University. The college is ruraly situated on a hillock at Edat, in Kadamangalam Grama Panchayat in Kannur District of Kerala and is located a few meters away from NH 86. The campus is spread across 65.72 acres of land and is rich in biodiversity.

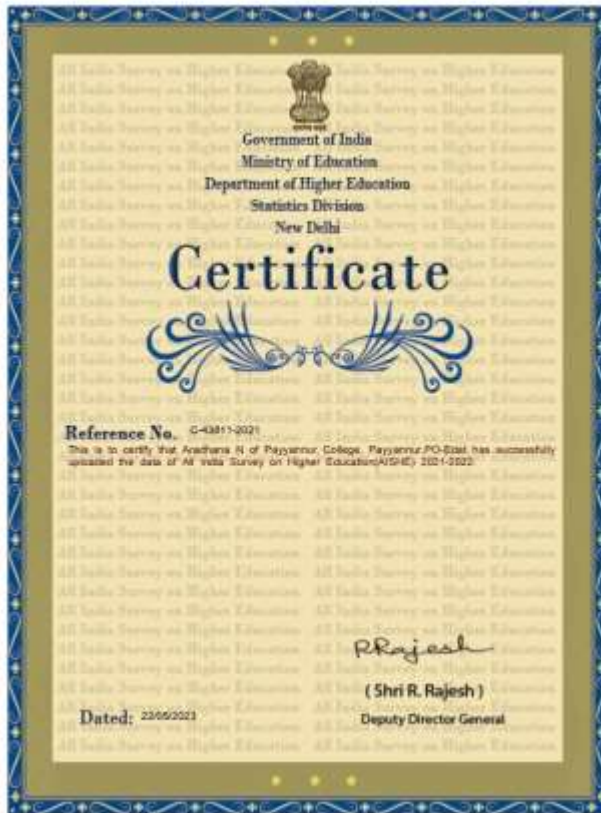
The college has formulated the vision to carry forward the message and practice of the founders who emphasized the worth of education as a means of social upward mobility for the rural people. The vision of the college is "Our Education, Our Future" which reminds us of the impact of education as envisaged by the enlightened people of Payyanur who came forward with an idea of founding an institution for imparting quality education to the rural and semi-urban population in and around Payyanur. The institution has strategic plans to actualize the vision through a stated mission. The mission statement of the institution is: Higher Education for Inclusiveness, Equity, Excellence and Sustainable, Holistic Development.

Since its inception, the college has steadfastly pursued its primary goal, to offer high-quality higher education to all the aspiring people living within its catchment area, irrespective of caste, creed, class, or religion. Adhering to the principles of reservation and norms of admissions based on merit, the college is able to serve the marginalized sections as well as the financially sound and academically competent class. Besides, Payyanur College is unique in its secular character and mode of functioning. The Payyanur Educational Society that runs the college is a non-partisan, non-communal, non-political charitable trust comprising members from all walks of life in Payyanur. In the midst of caste and communal institutions that come up in large numbers, this institution stands up in the bosom of secularism and democratic spirit.

The college serves the educational needs of about 1,950 students at undergraduate, postgraduate, and PhD levels, encompassing a diverse range of academic disciplines such as Science, Humanities, Commerce, and Management Studies. At the undergraduate level, the college offers programs in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Economics, History, Political Science, English, Malayalam, Hindi, Functional Hindi, Commerce, and Business Administration. For postgraduate studies, the college provides opportunities in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, English, and Plant Science. Additionally, the college offers PhD programs in Mathematics, Physics, and Hindi. The departments of Chemistry and English shall be upgraded as research departments in a month or two, on receiving sanction from the affiliating university. The college has a dedicated faculty team of 84 well-qualified teachers, with 71 holding permanent positions and 13 serving as guest lecturers. 48 teachers possess PhD degrees, while 12 have attained M.Phil Degrees. Furthermore, 18 faculty members are actively engaged in ongoing research, and nearly 54 teachers have made significant contributions through publications in their respective fields. 27 faculty members have served as resource persons at national or international seminars, highlighting the college's commitment to sharing knowledge beyond its campus boundaries. The institution has 19 research guides who ensure a robust research environment. In addition, there is a team of 31 non-teaching staff members who play a vital role in the college's functioning.
